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Introduction

This is a guide to services and help available for people who have an acquired brain injury (ABI) and their families. Some of the information will be relevant to **children** who have an ABI and their families too. An acquired brain injury can happen to anyone. It is sudden in onset and occurs after birth.

There are **many causes** of acquired brain injury (ABI) including:

- A road traffic accident
- A fall
- The result of an assault or violence
- Haemorrhage caused by blood vessels in the brain bursting
- Stroke caused by arteries which carry blood around the body becoming blocked
- Sudden lack of oxygen to the brain caused by some other medical condition
- An infection such as encephalitis or meningitis
- Complications of other illnesses or poisons

Acquired brain injury is a traumatic event for the person affected and their family. People who have had a more severe injury will have spent some time in a hospital such as Astley Ainslie. On returning home, it is important that you and your family receive information about your entitlement to help and the services available through the council, health and voluntary organisations.

But when is the right time to give information to individuals and families? Shortly after an acquired brain injury may not be the best time. Studies say that six months or more after the injury may be a better time. If you feel that this information is not for you just now, please set it aside and look at it when the time is right.

This guide draws together information about help available to people living in West Lothian and it includes services that are available throughout the Lothians that are available to you too. This includes information about:

- **Your rights and entitlements**, for example to money through the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP)
- **Voluntary organisations** that can provide support, for example Headway, Citizens Advice Bureau
- Support for you and your family at home for example through **local social work and health services**
- Help and opportunities to improve your **health, improve skills** that you may have lost, things to do during the day, and opportunities **to meet with other people** who have been through the same experience.

Brief description of the service, including who the service is for	<p>This Service provides specialist assessment and rehabilitation within the home or community setting to individuals over the age of 16 years who live in West Lothian and who have an acquired brain injury. The Service's core aim is to maximise individuals' independence, level of functioning, community reintegration and quality of life. The team provide specific advice and information to clients and their families and also respond to enquiries about acquired brain injury from individuals and organisations.</p> <p>The service also provides follow up and early intervention as required to individuals over the age of 16 years who have had a mild head injury.</p> <p>The Service is delivered by an experienced multi-disciplinary team – Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, Clinical Psychologists, Speech & Language Therapist and Rehabilitation Assistants.</p>

<p>Description of the service including who the service is for</p>	<p>In West Lothian, Social Work services for Adults and Older People are provided through the West Lothian Community Health and Care Partnership (CHCP). This used to be called the Social Work Department. Sometimes these Social Work services are also called community care services.</p> <p>Who can get Community Care Services?</p> <p>People who have an acquired brain injury (ABI) caused by a stroke or a traumatic injury such as a fall, assault or road traffic accident and people with a chronic disability are eligible for services.</p> <p>To be eligible for Community Care services you must be aged over 16 and have had a Community Care Assessment which has confirmed that you are in need of a services or services. A member of staff will discuss your situation with you (and your family and/or carer if you wish) in order to complete the community care assessment. This helps us to work out the type and amount of help or support you need. The community care assessment is recorded on a form and you will get a copy of your assessment.</p> <p>People who help or look after someone with an acquired brain injury may also be eligible for services to support them in their caring role and can request a Carers Assessment to look at their own needs. Again, a member of staff will complete the carers assessment with you to work out the support or help you need.</p> <p>The type of services provided by Social Work</p> <p>A range of services is provided for adults and older people. These are called community care services and include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Social Work staff to work with people and to offer information, advice, help and support ▪ Care at Home services where care workers can provide help in people's own homes. This help includes assistance with dressing, bathing, eating, medication and some household tasks. ▪ Supported Discharge and Re-enablement Team who offer short-term help to settle back at home after being discharged from hospital. ▪ Short breaks from caring for relatives, partners or others who look after someone with a disability or ill health. ▪ Care Home placements in the Council, private or voluntary sectors. ▪ Equipment, Technology and adaptations in people's own homes to help them to remain living at home and to manage any difficulties caused by disability or illness. ▪ Day services, training, further education and employment support opportunities for people with learning disabilities, physical disabilities, mental health and well-being issues and acquired brain injury. ▪ Sensory Impairment services for people with visual and/or hearing impairment ▪ Advice about welfare benefits and money matters for disabled people and their carers. ▪ Accommodation advice on housing issues.
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<p>How to get the service or make a referral</p>	<p>How can I get a service?</p> <p>Please contact your local office (see above) and ask to speak with the duty worker. This is the person you will speak to when you first get in touch with us – this can be on the telephone or in the office. The duty worker will ask you about your situation and will tell you about how we can look at what help or support you may need.</p> <p>How will the service be provided?</p> <p>Community care services can be provided directly by the Council, for example in a Care Home, or purchased by the Council from another organisation, for example, short breaks from caring.</p> <p>Direct Payments can also be offered. This is a cash payment made by the Council, following a community care assessment, to someone assessed as needing community care or children’s services. This means that you can arrange your own services, such as personal care or short breaks, and pay for them with the funds provided to you. There are responsibilities that go with choosing to arrange your services in this way but we can provide help with these as well. Social work staff will be able to explain all this to you.</p>
<p>Details of any charges for the service</p>	<p>You may have to pay a contribution towards the cost of some of your services. This will depend on a financial assessment, which looks at your income, savings and outgoings. Social work staff will complete this with you.</p>

Brief description of the service, including who the service is for	<p>The ACSS is part of West Lothian's Social Policy.</p> <p>The service is available, through a referral process, to adults between 16 and 65 who have a physical disability.</p> <p>The service offers 15 places a day in the centre itself and supports 12 community-based groups located across West Lothian.</p> <p>The service provides a range of individual therapeutic activities such as art therapy, aromatherapy and occupational activity as well as other learning, creative and recreational opportunities.</p> <p>Work experience opportunities are offered within the centre itself and support is offered to those wishing to return to work.</p> <p>The centre is the base for 5 different services including a Council Information and Housing Service, Disability West Lothian and a Community Rehabilitation and Brain Injury Service. The café bistro is open to the general public and general purpose rooms are available for community group hire.</p>

The Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) gives disabled people rights in the way they receive goods and services and use facilities.

You are protected from discrimination under the DDA if you have a physical or mental impairment that affects your ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. The affect must be:

- Substantial ('more than minor or trivial')
- Adverse and
- Long-term (lasting or likely to last for more than a year)

This means that people with mobility impairments, blind or partially sighted, deaf or hard of hearing, learning disabilities, mental health difficulties and physical disabilities all have protection under the DDA.

Rights have been introduced in three stages since 1996 but since October 2004 service providers may have to make other 'reasonable adjustments' to their premises and '**physical features**' so that there are no physical barriers stopping or making it difficult for people to use services.

Physical features include: paving, parking areas, building entrances and exits (including emergency escape routes) internal and external doors, gates, toilet and washing facilities, public facilities such as telephones, counters or service desks, lighting and ventilation, lifts and escalators etc. Outdoor facilities are included too: seating in gardens and pubs, stiles and pathways in country parks or fixed signs in a shop or leisure facility etc.

Most services are covered by the DDA. Any one who provides a service to the public is a service 'provider.' There are a few exceptions: private clubs, transport (but only the transport vehicle and not everything connected with it such as stations, airports, and booking facilities.) Not all manufactured goods are covered. It does not matter whether or not payment is made for the service'; it's providing the service that matters.

Disabled people have a right to all kinds of services: going to a restaurant, shopping for food or clothes, using the library, going to church etc. In other words all the services that everyone expects to be able to use. The Act tries to remove society's barriers that make an impairment into a disability.

Stroke is the single largest cause of disability in the United Kingdom. 10,000 people under the age of 55 years have a stroke every year - 1,000 of these are under the age of 30 years.

'Recovery and rehabilitation from stroke present particular challenges for the younger survivor. One day fit and well, the next moment disabled. The stroke survivor must come to terms with physical and emotional changes as well as significant lifestyle adjustments - mobility, job, income, dependence, relationships - everything changes.'

'With 90% of strokes affecting those aged over 55 years, services inevitably focus attention on the older stroke survivor. The specific and complex needs of the younger and the more active stroke survivor have not received the full attention that they deserve.'

'Before Different Strokes, there was no single organisation able to provide the comprehensive support service that younger survivors need.'

'Different Strokes helps stroke survivors of under retirement age to optimise their recovery, take control of their own lives and regain as much independence as possible by offering 'rehabilitative services', information and advice.'

'Different Strokes does this by:

- Organising a national network of weekly **exercise classes**, access to gyms, physiotherapy and swimming
- Providing practical, easy to use **information pack** for the recovering stroke survivor,
- Offering a '**StrokeLine**' **telephone service** so that younger stroke survivors can speak to other younger stroke survivors,
- Advice and information about further **education, training and job opportunities** for stroke survivors
- **Welfare benefits** and rights information
- Keeping stroke survivors informed, through **newsletters**, an interactive website and other means, of developments relevant to them.

We obtain the computers from many different sources and make sure that they are in a working condition, we do not supply modems as many clients use different means of going onto the internet, e.g. broadband etc. Once we have supplied the machines we tend to "walk away from them", in other words the machines become their property. We do however try to maintain the machines for them, so if they have any problems we will try and assist them with repairs.</p> <p>We also hope that by giving them a machine that it will encourage them to go on and obtain qualifications from outreach colleges etc. in this we have been quite successful, as clients realised their own potential.</p> <p>As a group we do not have any cash and occasionally sell a machine to buy parts that may be required to get a machine going again.</p>
