- Hairdryers
- Irons
- Vacuum cleaners
- Kettles
- Tools (drills, electric saws etc)
- Computer and telephone equipment
- Games consoles (Please ask for assistance for full range of small appliances)

Engine oil

(from householders only)

Fluorescent/energy savingtubes and bulbs Garden waste

- Flowers and plants
- Garden weeds
- Grass cuttings
- Hedge clippings
- Leaves and bark
- Small branches and twigs
- Cut flowers

(please place loose soil in separate container provided)

Gas bottles

(Commercial CO2 and Acetylene no longer accepted. Max weight 15 Kg)

Glass bottles and jars

 Separate glass banks for clear, green and brown glass

Large electrical appliances

- Cookers
- Microwaves
- Washing machines and tumble dryers
- Dishwashers

(Please ask for assistance for full range of large electrical appliances)

Blue Bin Recycling

(Separate container for large cardboard boxes)

- Aluminium and steel food and drinks cans
- Aluminium foil, trays and aerosol cans
- Paper, envelopes and cardboard food packaging
- Cardboard container for large cardboard boxes
- Plastic food trays, pots, bottles and tubs
- Empty plastic bags including carrier, bread, cereal.

- pre-packed vegetable and pasta bags
- Plastic lids and bottles tops including spray tops

Rubble and bricks

 Bricks, stone and slabs (No ceramics or tilesplease place in landfill container)

Scrap metal

 All types of metal (except large electrical appliances-please place in separate container provided)

Wood

- Chipboard and hardboard
- Fencing
- Plywood
- Window frames (glass removed)
- Solid wood doors
- Pallets
- Solid wood furniture
- Solid untreated wood and timber

Local businesses can bring key recyclable materials to West Lothian Recycling Centres

- Local businesses are permitted access to recycle specific materials, free of charge, at West Lothian Recycling Centres.
- A Business Recycling Access Pass is required to deposit materials at the Recycling Centres.
- Local businesses can deposit only:
 - glass bottles & jars
 - paper

- cardboard
- metal packaging
- scrap metal (not including electrical and
- electronic items)
- books
- DVDs
- Clothes
- No other type of waste will be accepted at the Recycling Centres.

How to obtain a Business Recycling Access Pass:

- Please email waste.services@westlothian.gov.uk to request a duty of care form.
- The form should be completed and returned before you visit the Recycling Centre.

 Please remember to bring your Business Recycling Access Pass with you when you visit the Recycling Centre as entry will be refused if you cannot present the pass.

Household Waste: Liveried Vehicles - Exemption - Permit Required

- if you want to use a liveried vehicle to dispose of non-commercial waste you must apply for a Residential Exemption Permit.
- A Residential Exemption Permit will allow a West Lothian household to visit the sites 24 times in a year to dispose of their own household waste only.
- A Residential Exemption Permit does not permit someone to carry waste from any other household.
- Users exceeding the 24 uses per year
 or being suspected of bringing in material
 associated with commercial activities will
 be subject to investigation by the council
 and the information passed to SEPA
 (Scottish Environmental Protection Agency)
 & HMRC (Her Majesty Revenue & Customs)
 for regulatory consideration.
- Note that under current regulations maximum penalties for fly-tipping are £40,000 fine and/or up to two years imprisonment.

Hired Vehicles - Exemption - No Permit Required

A West Lothian household hiring a van will be allowed to visit Recycling Centres, as long as
they can show valid ID such as a current driving licence or passport and recent council tax or utility bill, and
a copy of the hire contract to the Recycling Centre Assistant each time they visit. All details in these documents
should match.

West Lothian Council provides a special uplift service for bulky domestic waste:

A bulky uplift is £25 for up to 5 items

- A fridge/freezer is classed as one item
- All items to be placed on ground level
- All items listed for uplift should be left together by 7am in an area outside, nearest to access point for refuse vehicle
- Unfortunately, we cannot uplift items from inside your property, unless there are exceptional circumstances
- Please see website for details on what can be uplifted using the bulky uplift service and how to present items for uplift
- Collection times are Monday-Friday 7am-8pm

Bulky uplifts can be booked online or via the Customer Service Centre.
