# Reduce

Prevent waste. Buy less and avoid excessive packaging.

## Reuse

Repurpose or rehome items to be used elsewhere.

## Recycle

Turn waste either back into something new or back into the same product.

## Recover

Recover energy from waste materials, including anaerobic digestion and gasification.

### Disposal

Waste sent to landfill

The waste hierarchy puts different ways of dealing with waste into the best order for the environment. For example it is better for the environment to buy something without packaging, than to buy something with lots of packaging, even if you recycle it, due to the energy and resources used in its production and for recycling.

<u>www.reusingit.org</u> Based in West Lothian, Reusing IT refurbish old computers to give to low income families in Scotland and in developing countries.

When waste goes to landfill it produces carbon dioxide and methane - harmful greenhouse gases which contribute to global warming.

Passing your unwanted items onto charity to be resold is a great way to prevent waste going to landfill.

#### Hire

Sharing resources is a great way to avoid buying new, save money and stop items that you only need for a short time cluttering up your garage, shed or cupboards.

#### Repair

There are companies across West Lothian who repair a huge variety of items. These are just some of the things you can have repaired locally -

Bikes, Clothes, Upholstery, Hair straighteners, Jewellery, Musical instruments, Furniture, Computers, Laptops, Tablets, Games consoles, Phones, Sewing machines, Fridges, Washing machines, Ovens and other appliances.

A quick internet search or recommendations from friends and family can help you find someone reliable. Look out for organisations who run workshops on how to carryout repairs yourself.

#### Recycle

All of your clean paper, cardboard, cans, aerosols, foil, plastic bottles, lids, tubs and trays in your blue bin but there are many other materials which can be recycled through specialist collections...

**Batteries** — Any store that sells batteries will collect them for recycling. You could then replace your old batteries with rechargeable ones.

**Glass Points** – There are nearly 200 glass recycling points in West Lothian. Find your nearest one here. <a href="www.westlothian.gov.uk/article/4903/Glass-Recycling">www.westlothian.gov.uk/article/4903/Glass-Recycling</a>

**Inhalers** — You can return inhalers to various local pharmacies around West Lothian for recycling. Check www.pharmacyfinder.completethecycle.eu

**Phones** — sell your old or damaged phone to them or buy a reconditioned one instead of buying new.

**Spectacles** — <u>www.visionaidoverseas.org/recycling</u> - income generated from recycling glasses funds sustainable eye care in developing countries. Post or drop off at various opticians around West Lothian.

**Wine corks** – <a href="https://recorkeduk.org/">https://recorkeduk.org/</a> post to Recorked UK, they resell and donate a percentage of their profits to charity. Or you could put sliced or ground corks in the bottom of plant pots to help retain water.

There are also other schemes and drop off points which collect various items for recycling.

<u>Terracycle</u> - Collect and recycle various items that aren't included in kerbside recycling schemes, like <u>crisp packets</u>, <u>contact lenses and coffee pods</u>. Find collection points at <u>www.terracycle.com/en-GB/brigades</u>

<u>Tesco</u> in Bathgate have a collection point for **Ink jet** cartridges, batteries, water filters and energy saving lightbulbs.

The charity 'Against Breast Cancer' collects stamps, bras, printer cartridges, clothes and mobile phones.

#### Food waste

The easiest way to stop food waste is to only buy what you need and to use up everything you have before it goes off, but a third of space in the average grey bin is taken up by food waste!

Most people in West Lothian get a food waste collection and so any left overs of cooked or uncooked food can be recycled, but you could try home composting or donate food you won't use...

#### Community Fridges

A community fridge allows fresh food to be shared among a community instead of going to waste. The fridge will be in a public place, anyone can put food in and anyone can take food out. At the moment there are two community fridges in West Lothian

- Riverside Community Wing, Craigshill, Livingston
- The Dale Hub, Armadale
