

SQA 2020 National Courses – information for learners

Updated version 21 April 2020

SQA 2020 exams and coursework assessments are cancelled. However, you will still get your results by 4 August.

Any decisions we make about how to process and issue your results must be fair to all learners across Scotland. There are 4 steps to how you will get your 2020 results.

4 steps to how you will get your results by 4 August:

Step 1 - Estimates

- Your results will be based on estimate grades, which your teacher or lecturer will send to us.
- An estimate grade is what teachers or lecturers expect you to achieve. They will use their teaching knowledge and experience of how you have performed through the year.
- Your estimate grade is not just the result of one prelim or one project. It includes all the work that you have done across the year.

Step 2 - Awarding

• We will use the estimated information, as well as any previous results you may have achieved, to produce your 2020 results.

Step 3 - Results and Certification

• We will send your results by 4 August. If possible, please <u>sign-up to MySQA</u>, so you receive your results by text and/or email.

Step 4 - Appeals

- If you disagree with your results, please speak to your school or college who will be able to appeal the result for you. This service will be free and your school or college must have evidence to support the estimate.
- The evidence will be reviewed by senior examiners. We will provide schools and colleges with full details of this service shortly.
