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# About the Summer Reading Challenge website

The Summer Reading Challenge website is available year-round and enables children to keep track of their reading by setting up a personal profile where they can rate and review their books.

Children can track their reading over the summer and participate in fun Gadgeteers-themed activities. Each time a child finishes a book, they add it to their profile and leave a review. If they reach their summer reading goal, they will unlock a Gadgeteers certificate to print and keep. There are extra incentives including virtual badges, avatars, activity sheets and videos to unlock along the way.

Children can also use the website to access book recommendations, chat to other Challenge participants, enjoy exclusive author content, play games and enter competitions.

For the Summer Reading Challenge 2022, the website has been given a Gadgeteers theme.

# Information to know before signing up

## For new users

The Reading Agency websites use a system called Passport to manage user accounts. Once a Passport account has been created, it can be used across any of the Reading Agency websites, including Reading Groups for Everyone and World Book Night.

Children (any users under the age of 16) will not be able to register for a Passport account. A parent/carer must hold their own Passport account to sign up their child for the Summer Reading Challenge website. Once you have an adult (parent/carer) account, you can create child accounts and attach them to your account. This allows the child(ren) to have (a) separate profile(s) to you.

If a parent/carer is signing up more than one child for the Challenge, they can approve and manage multiple child accounts through the same (adult) Passport account.

The registration process is explained further below.

## For existing users

Children who have already signed up to the website for a previous Summer Reading Challenge or Winter Mini Challenge can log in using their existing username and password. Any books logged and virtual rewards unlocked in previous years will still be accessible through their profile page.

# Getting started

## For adults who have an existing Passport account

Parents/carers who have already created an account for use on a Reading Agency website can add a child to their Passport account straight away. See page 6.

## Creating an adult Passport account

For parents/carers who have not already created an account for use on a Reading Agency website, they will need to register for their own (adult) Passport account to continue. To sign up to Passport, parents/carers can click the 'Create a new account' link as shown on the login page above, or they can visit any Reading Agency website and choose the 'Join' button.

To register for a new account, select the 'Join' button on the Summer Reading Challenge homepage (either at the top left, or in the red 'Create a profile' box). This process must be completed by a parent/carer.



Enter the parent/carer's date of birth, and click 'Continue'.

On the next page, you will need to enter a username and a password. These details will be used to sign in the parent/carer on future visits.

If the username entered has already been taken by an existing account, this page will refresh. You do not need to use your real name as a username, and we recommend parents/carers do not enter their child's name as a username. They may also wish to try adding letters or numbers to the username to help make it unique.

The password must be at least six characters long.

Enter the parent/carer's name into the 'About you' fields, and fill in the remaining fields on the page.

Click 'Create profile' to continue.

## Adding a child to your Passport account

Once a parent/carer has created a Passport account of their own, they will be able to log in to the Summer Reading Challenge website by clicking 'Login', either at the top left, or in the red 'Already a member' box.



The following page will ask the parent/carer to enter their own Passport username and password, and click 'Login'.

On the next page, click 'add a new child account'.



The next page will ask the parent/carer to enter a unique username and password for the child, and to complete key information about their child to set up their profile. We recommend parents/carers do not enter their child's real name as a username. They may also wish to try adding letters or numbers to the username to help make it unique. Once this information has been submitted, the child's account will go live. The child can visit the Summer Reading Challenge website and log in with the username and password for their child account.

To create Passport accounts for additional children, the parent/carer should ensure they have logged out of their first child's account. The option to register for a new account will not appear if a user is already logged in. Repeat the steps under 'Adding a child to your Passport account' (page 6) to create a Passport account for a new child.

The parent/carer can manage their child's information through their own (adult) account. Once logged in, clicking the tab labelled 'Children' will list any child account that is attached to that adult account. Here, the parent/carer can view and manage their child(ren)'s personal information and reset their account password(s).

## Completing a child's Gadgeteers profile

To start the online Summer Reading Challenge, children can log in via the Summer Reading Challenge homepage (either at the top left, or by clicking the 'Login' button in the red 'Already a member' box).

Every child on the website is given a screen name to help keep them anonymous. When children post comments to the chat page, write book reviews, enter competitions, or rank on the games leaderboard, their entries will appear under their personal screen name.

The screen name provides an extra level of security as no personal details are displayed on the Summer Reading Challenge website. The username and password chosen by the user during the registration process are still valid and will still be used to log in to the website. These details are only known to the account holder.

The screen name appears once the child is logged in, and is visible to all website users. It helps to protect all users including those who have put their real name as their username.

The screen name is made up of three random words, for example 'Coach Quincy Bucket'. The first time a child signs in, they will have a one-time opportunity to change their screen name.

Once a child has logged in, they can click 'Continue' to move onto the website.



The first time a user signs in, they will need to set up their Gadgeteers profile. We recommend users set up their profile straight away so they will be able to access all areas of the website. Click 'Continue' to get started.



First, you will be asked to select an avatar. Just like the screen name, when a child posts comments to the Chat page or writes book reviews, their avatar will appear next to their submissions.

When they start the Challenge, children can choose from two characters: Maggie and Ajay. As they progress through the Challenge, they will unlock additional Gadgeteers characters.



Select a character, and click 'Continue'.

On the next screen, children have the option of picking a different screen name if they don't like the one that was automatically created for them.

The auto-generated name will show in the red box. Click 'Spin again' to see a different screen name option. Once you're happy with the screen name, click 'Continue' to save it and move on.

Once set, the screen name cannot be changed. To receive a new screen name after leaving this page, the user would have to sign up for a new account and start again, which we do not recommend.



Selecting an avatar and a screen name will unlock the first reward badge. All badges are accessible from the user's profile page.

The following screen confirms that the user has set up their profile, and has officially started the Challenge! Click 'Explore' to move to the main site.



# Taking part in the Challenge online

The 'Home section of the site contains information about the child's Challenge progress, books they have read, their reading wishlist, reviews, badges, and rewards.



The 'My profile' section shows the child's progress against their reading goal, books they've read, their badges and rewards, and their reading wishlist. Users can return to this page at any time by clicking the 'My challenge' button at the top left of the screen.



The counter at the top left shows the number of books that have been added by Reading Challenge members.

## Finding books to read



In the Book Sorter, children can find books recommended by other Summer Reading Challenge website users. The Book Sorter only recommends titles that have been rated and reviewed by children using the website. Click on a book cover to find out more about it and to read reviews.

The official Gadgeteers Book Collection features titles chosen by children and librarians to reflect this year's theme of science and innovation.

Click on 'Find a read' to view the Gadgeteers Book Collection, and to read top tips about how to access books from home.



## Adding books to your Challenge

Children can keep track of books they see on the website that they are interested in reading using the 'My wishlist' section of their profile. Clicking the red 'Add to wish list' button next to a book will add the book to the child's wishlist.

Add to wish list

Each time a child finishes reading a book, they can add it to their profile to count towards their Summer Reading Challenge 2022 goal.

To add a book to their Challenge, a child should go to the 'My profile' page, scroll down to the 'Books you've read' section



and click the yellow 'Add a book to your profile' button.

On the next page, enter the title of the book and click 'Search'.

Once the book has been selected, on the next page, the child can rate the book out of 5 and add a review. Click on 'Add this title' to finish adding the book to the child's Challenge.

The book will now appear on the 'Books you've read' list, and the progress bar will update to show a book has been added.

### Book reviews

Click on a book on the 'Books you've read' list will show all the reviews that title has received on the website.

Once a review has been checked and approved by a Summer Reading Challenge website moderator, it will be published on the book's page.

### Unlocking rewards and virtual badges

As a reader progresses through their Challenge, they will unlock rewards, including virtual badges, activity sheets and videos.

Virtual badges are displayed in the 'Your badges and rewards' box on the 'My profile' page. They are also displayed in the 'Badges & rewards' section.

Badges that have been unlocked will light up. Badges that have not yet been collected are greyed out.



Children taking part in the Challenge via their local library will receive special codes on their sticker sheets. Each of these codes unlocks a reward when it is entered into the box on the 'My profile' page, under 'Your badges and rewards'.



## Completing the Challenge

When a child reaches their reading goal, they will unlock a certificate which will appear alongside their other rewards.

The certificate can be downloaded and printed for the child to keep!

To view a high contrast version of the website, click on the 'High Contrast' button at the bottom right of any page.

## <u>Login help</u>

If a parent/carer receives a message stating their email is already in use, this means they have already registered for an adult account in The Reading Agency's Passport system.

If the parent/carer has forgotten the password associated with their account, they can click the 'Forgotten your password?' link on the login screen to reset it.
