New school takes shape

Initial work to build the new primary school for the south of Armadale is progressing well.

A significant amount of work has taken place onsite in the last few months, including constructing the site entrance road base and drainage works within the site

Local residents will have noticed the main section of structural steel frame at the gym area has been completed, and the external scaffold has commenced to the administration section of the new school.

Head of Education James Cameron said: "The past few months have seen a huge amount of activity on the new Armadale primary school site. Local residents will have noticed the difference in the site already, with the outline of the new school starting to take shape. We are still in the early phases of the building project, but work is currently progressing well towards the August 2016 opening date."

Executive councillor for education, Lawrence Fitzpatrick added: "I'm delighted to see the progress taking place towards the new primary school for the south of Armadale."



"We are committed to delivering the new school for the growing community at Southdale, with the name for the school expected to be agreed by Council Executive in December."

Other work, ongoing and completed, includes:

- Blockwork for the foundation
- Ground floor concrete floor slab works
- Street lighting diversion
- Pitch formation works
- Edge protection installed to the gym area.

All about the new Armadale Primary school



Cost of new school will be **£7.5million**

West Lothian Council forward-funding the project to **accelerate development**

Land transfer contract signed by developer in May 2015, with work starting onsite in **June 2015**

New school will be built in two phases, with **16 new classrooms, school nursery, gym** and **community wing** when complete

First phase of the school to open for the 2016/17 academic year, with **eight new classrooms, two General Purpose rooms** and **nursery provision for 60 pupils**

Gym and **dining** accommodation

First phase of landscaping will also include one **grass pitch** and one tarmac **Multi-User Games Area (MUGA)**.

Second phase landscaping will also include for a **full size community use grass pitch**

Ogilvie Construction Limited appointed to build the school.

Photovoltaic (solar) panels will be installed on the roof along with a greatly increased insulation envelope and air tight design to save energy costs
